





Every summer since 1974, Ariel Ministries has welcomed students of all ages from many countries to join us for our Messianic discipleship program held at Camp Shoshanah. It is nestled in the beautiful Adirondack Mountains of Upstate New York, and provides a program of rich Bible study, fellowship, and fun.

It is beneficial for the student to complete the entire 2 or 3 week programs, if possible. You can attend from 1 to 8 weeks plus the Labor Day Weekend of the Program depending on your schedule. Our program centers on the grounding and growth of believers through in-depth study of the Scriptures from a Jewish perspective. The time of Bible study combined with worship, fellowship, and the beautiful surroundings, makes Camp Shoshanah the perfect retreat for refreshment and renewal of your faith.

Throughout the years, our Messianic Jewish Studies Program has been growing. We now offer an eight-week program teaching various Bible topics and courses from a Messianic Jewish Perspective. There is a two-week curriculum followed by a three-week curriculum, followed by a one-week course on the Life of Messiah from a Jewish Perspective. The seventh and eighth weeks are new and can be attended together or individually.

You may attend for one to eight weeks depending on your schedule. Students are encouraged to attend all eight weeks of the program if their schedule allows.

THE BREAKDOWN

Classes begin on Monday morning and end on Friday evening. During the first two weeks, the program will run four hours per day. During the next four weeks, the program will run five hours per day. Week 1 - July 8-12

The Book of Joshua

Along with Caleb, Joshua was one of two surviving members of his generation who entered the Promised Land. Preparation for assuming his leadership of the children of Israel was Moses' responsibility. Your study of Joshua's life and mission will be an exciting adventure of discovery about the Israelites early days in the Land.

Week 2 - July 15-19

Judges and Ruth

These two history books are set in the time when Israel was in the Land but not yet a unified nation. Although God continues to hear the cry of the children of Israel each time they fall away and face turmoil, they fall ever further into spiritual blindness because of their disobedience. Eventually, even the spiritual leaders become immune to their own glaring indifference to God's Word. In all, God sent twelve Judges to save the children of Israel. Seven of these Judges are treated in detail as Israel goes through each cycle of apostasy, oppression, repentance, and salvation by a Judge. The Book of Ruth, an appendix to the Book of Judges, presents enormously touching portraits of Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz. They are pictured as part of the faithful community of Messianic Jewish believers of their own time, worthy ancestors of King David and the promised King Messiah yet to be revealed.

each an hour long per day for the two and three-week programs. The three-week program has a required fifth session for first-time attendees: The Survey of the Life of Messiah, which runs for 75 minutes each day. The sixth-week program will also run for five hours a day giving a complete detailed study of Messiah's life.

A youth program is provided during the adult sessions. We have designed our schedule for the maximum teaching time during the day, while allowing ample time for fun and fellowship. The afternoons and weekends allow plenty of free time for worship, fellowship, hiking and recreation at Trout Pond, as well as various other activities located nearby.

Each Friday evening we have a special Shabbat service and dinner. Saturday is a free day for campers who will continue their study and a departure day for those who are leaving. On Sunday mornings, we gather for a time of worship led by Ariel staff members and students. If you play a musical instrument, please bring it along to share with us. Saturday and Sunday evenings are reserved for lakeside cookouts with music, dance, and fellowship.

Weeks 1-2 - July 8-19

The Book of Deuteronomy

Deuteronomy means "Second Law." Following forty years in the wilderness as a consequence of Israel's lack of belief, the children of the Exodus generation stood poised to enter the land that would become their home. Before they could cross the Jordan, Moses taught them how to observe the Law first entrusted to their parents at Mount Sinai. This will be the subject of your study.

Weeks 3,4,5 - July 22-August 9

Jewish History

This course provides a survey that begins with a look at the world of the Patriarchs: Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and their journey to the land God promised to give to the people of Israel. This study traces the history of the Jewish people through the nations. Emphasis is on the last 2,000 years as wandering and persecution forms their community and takes them throughout the world. Most importantly, we'll trace the outworking of God's covenant promises to the Jewish people as Messiah is revealed to Jew and Gentile alike.

Weeks 3,4,5, - July 22-August 9

Highlights of Isaiah

The Lord asked, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?" Isaiah's response launched his ministry as God's prophet in the southern kingdom of Judah. Wearing sackcloth and walking barefoot, as a sign to Israel of her coming destruction, Isaiah's work spanned the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah. This study will help you understand the historical context of Isaiah's life, and gain insight into the outworking of God's plan for all humanity.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH (0 - 16 years of age)

Serious Bible education is required for our youth. While opportunities for good fun abound, first and foremost the Shoshanah facility is a Discipleship Program. During adult classes, we will conduct Bible teaching and a recreation program for children ages 0 - 16 years of age. Topics will mirror the adult program.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Accommodations include cabins for married couples and families; separate bunkhouses for single men and single women, and camp grounds (tent, camper, or RV). All accommodations are available on a first-come, first-served basis, giving early registrants preference regarding dates of attendance. You may also commute from one of the local motels (contact Camp Shoshanah for a list). Pets are NOT permitted.

A study of the principles of the spiritual life and spiritual warfare, together with the role of the Holy Spirit, the new nature, the word, the flesh and the devil.

The Life of the Messiah


This is the complete course taught in one week. Based on the book, The Harmony of the Gospels, this class is a study through all four gospels. It focuses on the events in the life of the Messiah from a Jewish perspective, shedding light on Jewish theology and customs that surround our Messiah.


